
Item No. 1. The committee deferred the agenda item No. 1.


Item No. 2. The committee approved the paper-setters/examiners of the following courses for
the examinations of 2020-21:

- 1. B.E. (Chemical)
- 2. B.E. (Chemical with MBA)
- 3. B.E. (Food Technology)
- 4. M.E. (Chemical)
- 5. M.Sc. (Industrial Chemistry)
- 6. M.E. (Food Technology)

Item No. 3. The committee with majority decision approved the complete scheme and detailed syllabus of M.Sc. (Industrial Chemistry) ^{revised} as recommended by sub-committee ^{1st to 4th Sem for the batch 2020.} constituted by the DUI, Panjab University. Only two members raised their objections. Prof. Seema Kapoor was of the opinion that the scheme should be circulated in advance. Prof. Anupama Thakur expressed that Chemical Technology subjects which was spread in two semesters in the earlier scheme should not have been combined as it is relevant for M.Sc. (Industrial Chemistry) students. Prof. Seema Kapoor said that Process Instrumentation (P.I.) should be compulsory subject and should not be placed in electives. To this Prof. Ajay Bansal objected saying that Analytical Technique is more important and industrially relevant subject than P.I. and M.Sc. students also need this for their further research and NET examination. Prof. J.K. Goswamy apprised the members about the representation made by the M.Sc. students requesting inclusion of more Chemistry subjects which will be beneficial for the future prospects and court case.

Prof. S.K. Sharma expressed that we should go ahead with the scheme and if need be, it can be revised later next year. All committee members expressed that the scheme and syllabi for the 1st Semester is appropriately designed for further research & NET exam. and was approved unanimously.
